



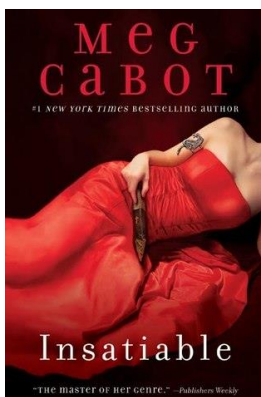

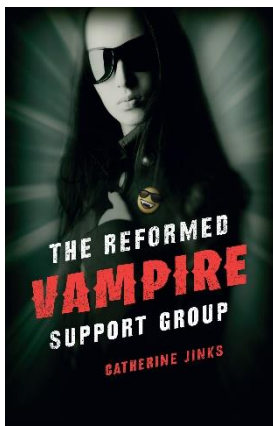
Insatiable by Meg Cabot

Dangerous Girls by R.L. Stine

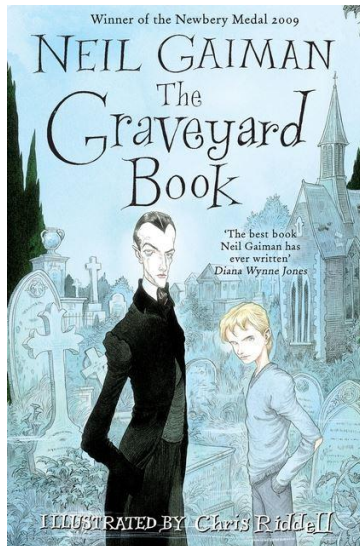

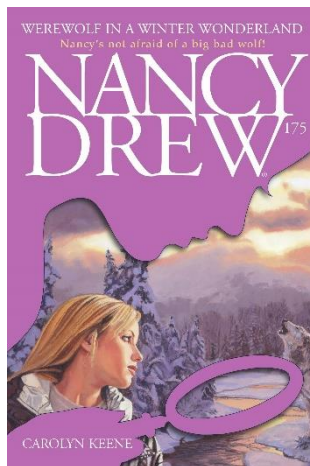


The Graveyard Book by Neil Gaiman

Werewolf in a Winter Wonderland by Carolyn Keene

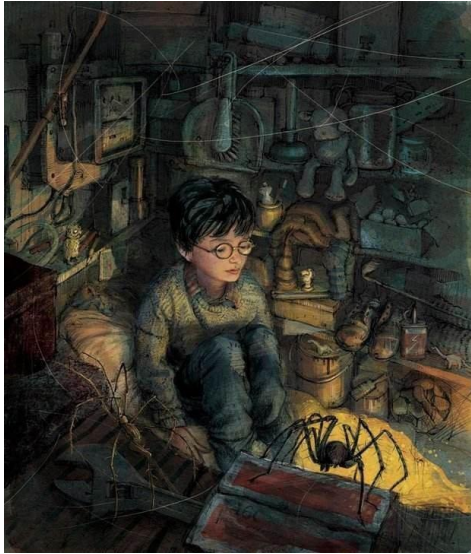

Harry Potter Series by J. K. Rowling

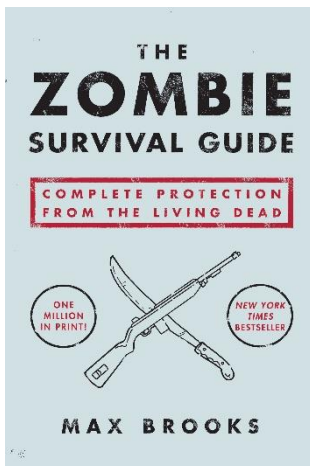

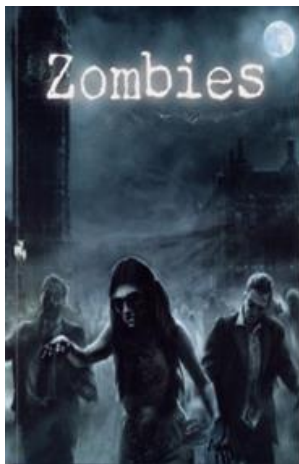


The Night Bus by Anthony Horowitz

Greatest Zombie Movie Ever by Jeff Strand

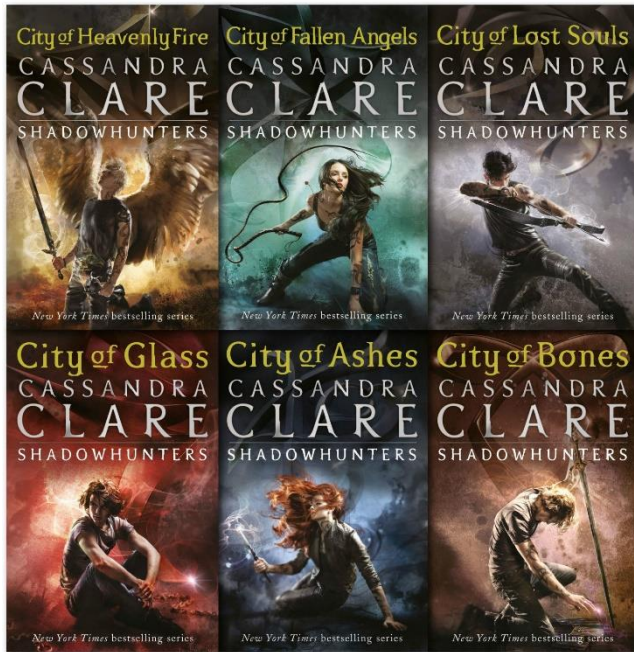

Clockwork Angel, Clockwork Prince, Clockwork Princess

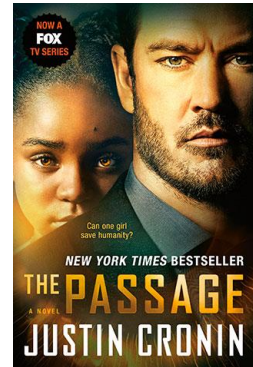

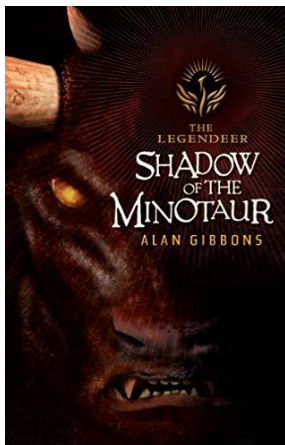
Blue Bloods series by Melissa de la Cruz

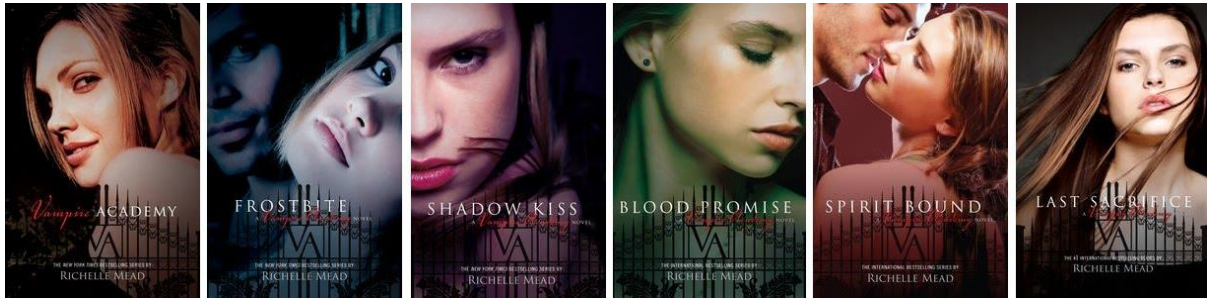

Vampire Academy series by Richelle Mead

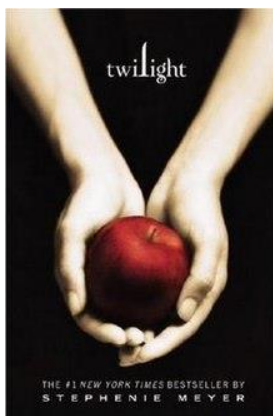
Vampire Academy, Frostbite, Shadow Kiss, Blood Promise, Spirit Bound, Last Sacrifice

Twilight, New Moon, Eclipse, Breaking Dawn

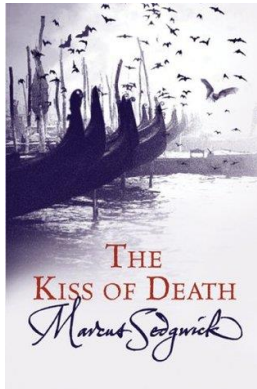

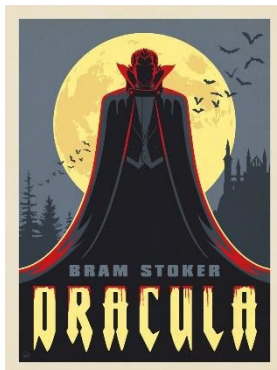
Birth of a Killer by Darren Shan

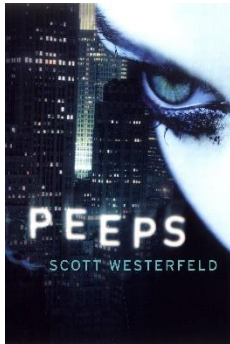


Dracula by Bram Stoker

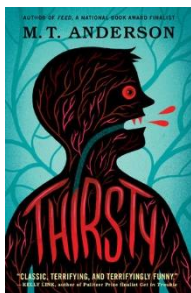
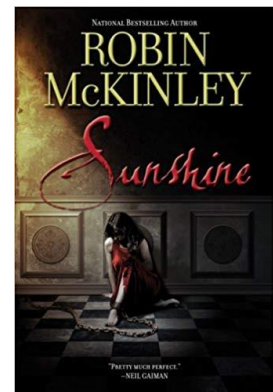

Thirsty by M T Anderson

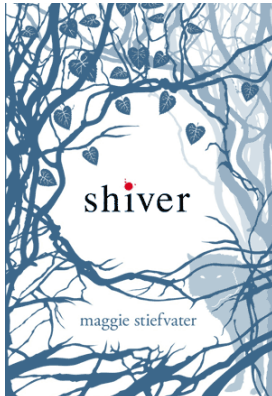

Shiver by Maggie Stiefvater

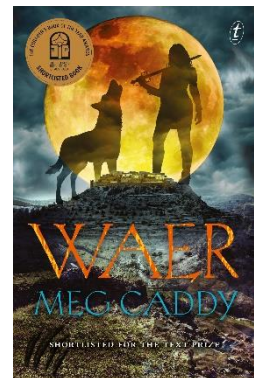

Ashes by Ilsa J. Bick

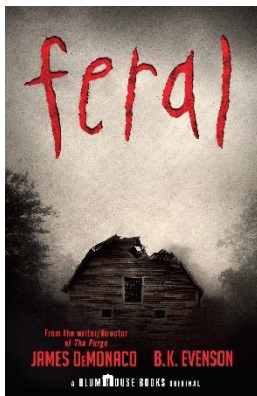

The Zombie Survival Guide by Max Brooks

If you have a kid who talks about the coming of the zombie apocalypse like it's an absolute certainty, they have to read this book. This survival guide takes its premise very, very seriously. Brooks is an expert in disaster response and preparedness (he's lectured around the globe) and he very calmly and very rationally breaks down exactly what you'd actually want to do if a zombie plague started spreading across the world. This will scare the pants off some kids and other kids will think it's the coolest thing they've ever read.

**Feral** by James DeMonaco and B.K. Evenson

A fire at a top research facility released an airborne pathogen that quickly spread to every male on the planet, killing most. These new men, ferals, were driven to destroy every remaining woman. Three years later, Allie has joined a group of hardened and well-armed women fighting for survival in an isolated encampment. In the wilderness beyond their guarded walls, the ferals' numbers are swelling. Allie knows something catastrophic is brewing on the horizon, and hope is running out. The ferals are coming, and there is no stopping them.

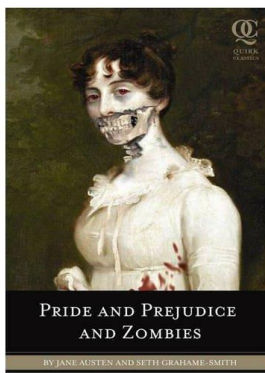
The Outlands trilogy by Jackie French

Dead of Night: A Zombie Novel by Jonathan Maberry

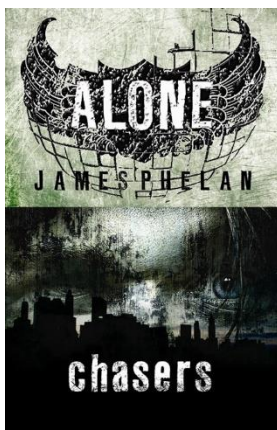

The source book for every subsequent tale of zombie apocalypse, Before *The Omega Man*, *I Am Legend* had already been made into a movie called *The Last Man On Earth*, with Vincent Price.

Warm Bodies by Isaac Marion

R is having a no-life crisis—he is a zombie. He has no memories, no identity, and no pulse, but he is a little different from his fellow Dead. He may occasionally eat people, but he'd rather be riding abandoned airport escalators, listening to Sinatra in the cozy 747 he calls home, or collecting souvenirs from the ruins of civilization. And then he meets a girl. First as his captive, then his reluctant guest, Julie is a blast of living colour in R's grey landscape, and something inside him begins to bloom. He doesn't want to eat this girl—although she looks delicious—he wants to protect her. But their unlikely bond will cause ripples they can't imagine, and their hopeless world won't change without a fight.



Alone Series by James Phelan **Chasers, Survivor, Quarantine**
