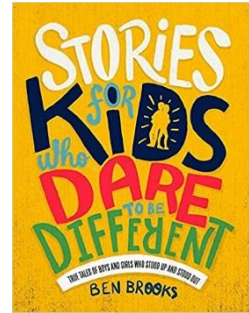


Biographies for Junior Readers

Greta's Story: The Schoolgirl Who Went on Strike to Save the Planet by Valentina Camerini, 2019

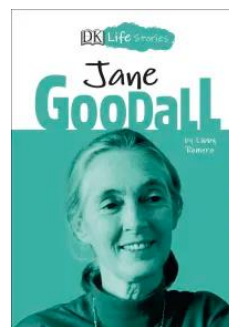

The TV news reports rising temperatures, and there have been numerous fires throughout Sweden. Fifteen-year-old Greta Thunberg decides she can't wait any longer: politicians must do something to save the environment. Instead of returning to school, Greta takes a placard and goes on strike in front of Sweden's parliament building. Greta's protest began the Fridays for Future – or School Strike 4 Climate – movement, which millions have now joined around the world. This is her story, but also that of many other girls and boys around the world willing to fight against the indifference of the powerful for a better future.

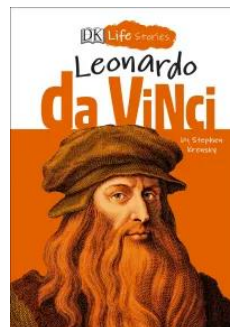

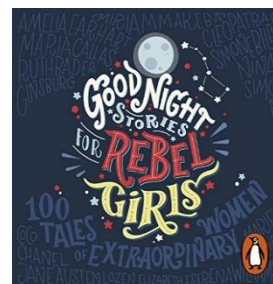


Good Night Stories for Rebel Girls: 100 Tales of Extraordinary

Women by Elena Favilli and Francesca Cavallo, 2017

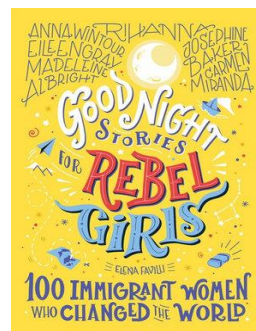

Good Night Stories for Rebel Girls: 100 Immigrant Women who Changed the World by Elena Favilli, 2020

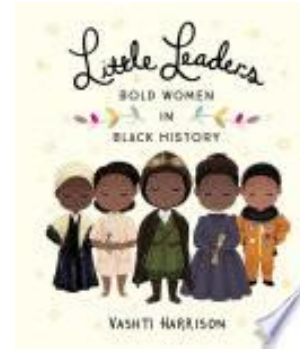

Little Leaders: Bold Women in Black History by Vashti Harrison, 2018

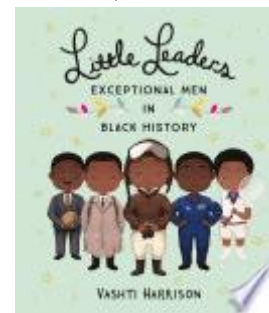
Meet the little leaders. They're brave. They're bold. They changed the world.

Little Leaders: Visionary Women Around the World by Vashti Harrison, 2018

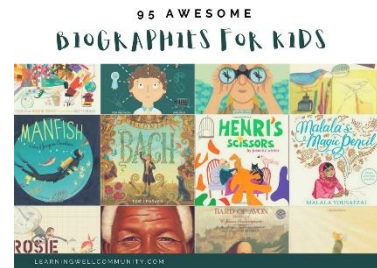

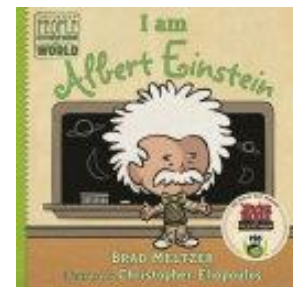


Ordinary People Change the World: I Am Albert Einstein by Brad Meltzer, 2014

Little Heroes: Courageous People Who Changed the World by Heidi Poelman , Kyle Kershner (Illustrator), 2018

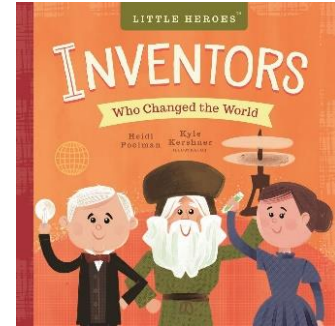

Little Heroes : Inventors Who Changed the World

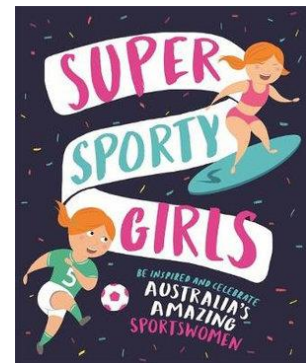

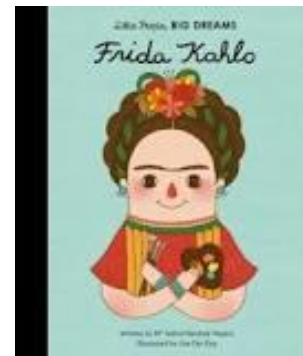
Little People, Big Dreams - Frida Kahlo by Isabel
