Dorothy and her dog, Toto, are whisked to the magical land of Oz where they meet the Tin Woodsman, the Scarecrow, and the Cowardly Lion. Mike Cavallaro transforms L. Frank Baum's world of Oz into a manga-influenced graphic novel.

Madeline 15 book Series by Ludwig Bemelmans, 1939 -

Madeline is one of the best-loved characters in children's literature. Set in picturesque Paris, these tales have as much appeal today as they have in the past. The combination of a spirited heroine, timelessly appealing art, cheerful humour, and rhythmic text makes the Madeline books perennial favourites with children of all ages.

Be Prepared by Vera Brosgol, 2018



This volume collects the classic stories from the birth of a new era for Superman including the Man of Steel #1-6, Superman #1-4, Action Comics #584-587, Adventures of Superman #424-428, and profiles from Who's Who- Update '87.
















Cici's Journal by Joris Chamblain and Aurélie Neyret, 2017


Geronimo Stilton Graphic Novels 22 book series by Elisabetta Dami and Tom Angleberger, 2009 -




Fox & Rabbit 3 book series by Beth Ferry and Gergely Dudás, 2020

A series for emerging readers about the simple magic of true friendship

The Adventures of Asterix 38 book series by Rene Goscinny and Albert Uderzo, 1959 - The series follows the adventures of a village of Gauls as they resist Roman occupation in 50 BCE. They do so by means of a magic potion, brewed by their druid Getafix, which temporarily gives the recipient superhuman strength. The title character Asterix and his friend Obelix, have various adventures, they often travel to foreign countries, while other tales are set in and around their village.







InvestiGators 3 book series by John Patrick Green, 2020

This goofy graphic novel series follows the super spy alligator duo, MANGO and BRASH, the InvestiGators, as they travel through the sewers and fight the forces of evil. With their very exciting Spy technology and their triedand-true, travel techniques, the InvestiGators are undercover and on the case.




The Adventures of Tintin 24 book series by Herge, 1929-1976

The Lost Warrior 15 book series by Erin Hunter and james L Barry, 2007




Nancy Drew Girl Detective 24 book series by Carolyn Keene and Stefan Petrucha and Sarah Kinney, 2004-2012


Amulet 9 book Series by Kazu Kibuishi, 2008-2021

Pawcasso by Remy Lai, 2021

Every Saturday, Pawcasso trots into town with a basket, a shopping list, and cash in paw to buy groceries for his family. One day, he passes eleven-year-old Jo, peering out the window of her house, bored and lonely. Astonished by the sight of an adorable basket-toting dog on his own, Jo follows Pawcasso, and when she's seen alongside him by a group of kids from her school, they mistake her for Pawcasso's owner. Excited to make new friends, Jo reluctantly hides the truth. But what starts as a small lie quickly grows into a Great Dane-sized one.



A poignant, laugh-out-loud illustrated middle-grade novel about an eleven-year-old boy's immigration experience, his annoying little brother, and their cake-baking hijinks!

The Baby-Sitters Club Graphix 7-14 book series by Ann M. Martin and Raina Telgemeier, 2015 -




Real Pigeons 7 book series by Andrew McDonald and Ben Wood (Illus), 2018

A dog stands guard in his backyard, ready to bark at anything that comes near. Follow the tales of three animals on one wild afternoon. In this clever wordless comic, each animal is a hero in its own story and all three stories are connected. The simple storytelling engages young readers and provides a gateway into understanding multiple perspectives and points of view.















Treasure in the Lake by Jason Pamment

Iris and Sam have been friends their whole lives but over the last few years they have found themselves drifting apart. Iris wants nothing more than to leave their small town and become a famous explorer, while Sam loves his home and quiet life. When the lake and river that run behind the town suddenly dry up overnight the two former friends stumble upon an amazing sunken city. Iris is thrilled and eager to explore this hidden wonder, whereas Sam would rather alert an adult and make it back to town for a sculpture unveiling. Secrets about the lost city soon begin to surface and the two will need to



discover the truth and save their friendship before history has a chance to repeat itself.


The Smurfs 28 book series by Peyo, 2010-2020

The Adventures of Jack Scratch: The Quest for the Hiss-Paniola by Craig Phillips, 2018



For fans of Amulet and middle grade readers who love sweeping worlds like Star Wars, the first book of the Lightfall series introduces Bea and Cad, two unlikely friends who get swept up in an epic quest to save their world from falling into eternal darkness.



The Golden Twine Cat's Cradle Series: Book 1 by Jo Rioux, 2012

This is a steampunk fantasy graphic novel with a multi-layered plot, a range of intriguing characters and a smart protagonist whose sights are set on a seemingly impossible task. The first book in this series seamlessly lays out the fantastic world the stories inhabit. The dark and spooky illustrations and the story's numerous plot twists and savvy humour are sure to keep even reluctant readers flying through the pages.



Deltora Quest 10 book Series by Emily Rodda and Makoto Niwano, 2005-2008

Deltora Quest follows the journey of Lief, who, on his birthday, sets out to fulfill his father's quest to restore the Belt of Deltora. Joining Lief is an ex-palace guard named Barda. Along the way they meet with Jasmine: a wild child of the Forests of Silence, who can speak to trees and has two pets: a raven named Kree and a small, gray, furry creature called Filli. Their quest is to find the seven gems of the fabled Belt of Deltora hidden in dangerous locations around Deltora.




Owly Graphic Novels! By Andy Runton, 2004-

blend of words and Owly's
















Sherlock Bones and the Natural History Mystery by Renee Treml
